"Inflationary Pressure on Indian Economy" Seminar report

Two days National Level Seminar on "Inflationary Pressure on Indian Economy" was organized by Rayat Shikshan Sanstha's C. D. Jain College of Commerce, Shrirampur sponsored by UGC on 29th and 30th August, 2016.

Inaugural Function and Technical Session I:

Inauguration Session of the seminar was chaired by Hon' Mrs. Meenatai Jagdhane, Member, Managing Council, Rayat Shikshan Sanstha, Satara. The Chief Guests Prin. Dr. Srirang Zaware, Ex-Joint Secretary (Higher Edu.), Rayat Shikshan Sanstha, Satara and Mr. Prakash Nikam Patil, Member, General Body, Rayat Shikshan Sanstha, Satara were present for the session.

Session started with the brief introduction of the seminar given by Prof.Dr. Gawali S. N., Co-ordinator of the seminar. Prin.Dr. L. D. Bhor delivered an introductory speech and gave a brief introduction of the dignitaries present on the Dias. Inflation in agriculture sector has increased the number of suicides among farmers. Long term measures to revamp the agricultural and food sector are need of an hour. Dr. Sanjay Vaidya mentioned that even after 25 years of economic reforms, the condition of the farmers is miserable due to inflation. Inflation cant be avoided completely. Inflation, upto certain extent, serves as a tonic for the economy. But when inflation reaches double digit (i.e., hyperinflation), it starts affecting the economy. The most negative impact is seen on agricultural sector.

Chairperson Prof. Pawar N.C. summed up the session by highlighting that 5 to 6 % inflation is not inflation in the real sense. Such inflation is necessary to economic development and for stability of economic growth.

Session Incharge Dr. Bakhale S. R. briefed the participants about the Resource Person and Chairperson of the session. Resource person spoke about the causes and effects of inflation in India. He mainly discussed effects of inflation on employment. He mentioned that India has been plagued with the disease of inflation since 1950 and even today its suffering. He specifically mentioned how inflation leads to unemployment which in turn gives rise to inflation.

Chairperson Prof. Rahane A.B. mentioned that a year before there was a situation in when *Tur Daal* was cheaper then chicken. All such factors affect the poor people. Food inflation is the basic cause of corruption.

Chairperson Dr. Mrs. Chavhan summed up the session by pointing out various demand side and supply side causes of inflation. Demand side causes include increase in supply of money, increase in disposable income, deficit financing and increase in foreign exchange reserve. Supply side causes include rise in administered prices, eratic agricultural growth, agricultural price policy and inadequate industrial growth.

Session Incharge Prof. Kulkarni S. V. introduced the resource person and chairperson of the session. Dr. Bhosale mentioned that the food inflation has become a burning issue in India today. It is affecting all the sectors of the economy and is a big threat to the life and livelihood of a common man. Recent data of the food inflation show that prices of all vegetables, fruits and protein based food items increased by an average 0.63% pushing the overall inflation rate to 10.05%. he also suggested some of the remedies such as increased farm output, low cost of inputs, increase in the share of irrigated land, improvement in the storage and processing infrastructure, improvement in the supply chain and development of crops that can withstand abnormal weather conditions.

Chairperson Khaire M. G. summed up the session saying that food inflation is the key priority of the Government and policy makers as it impacts the weaker sections of the society. The issue should be tackled by addressing supply side risks through economic and policy oriented actions and by mitigating risks due to natural calamities.
